"Some people say You are John the Baptist or Elijah," some of Jesus' friends answered. "And some people say You are one of the prophets come back to life."


Then Jesus asked them another question. "Who do YOU say that I am?"

all the wonderful things Jesus had said and done. God helped Simon Peter know the truth. "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God," he answered.




Mark 1; Luke 5—Jesus Chooses Four Followers

copies of the Four Followers Book for each child (continued on p.162) construction paper (1 sheet per child) crayons or markers scissors glue stapler







Directions

Color and cut out the six scenes. Cut a piece of construction paper in half widthwise. Fold the two pieces of construction paper together to make a book (see the example). Staple the book at the center. Decorate the cover as you like. Glue each scene to a separate page of the book in the order in which they are numbered, starting on the inside of the front cover. Use the book to retell the story of how Jesus chose four followers:

- 1) Jesus was teaching by a lake.
- 2) The crowd was so large that Jesus got into one of the fishing boats and asked the fisherman named Peter to take the boat out into the water. Jesus taught the people from the boat.
- Jesus told the fishermen to go out into deeper water. He said they would catch fish. Peter did not believe that they would catch anything, but he did as Jesus said.
- 4) Peter and Andrew let down their nets and caught so many fish that their nets began to break.
- James and John, also fishermen, hurried to help from another boat, but both boats were so full they began to sink.
- Peter, Andrew, James, and John realized how special Jesus was, and they left their boats and followed Jesus.





Zacchaeus

INSTANT DRAMA

CHARACTERS: Zack, Friend 1, Friend 2, Jesus, Crowd

SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:1-10

PROPS: money: fake or real, chair

Zacchaeus, also known as Zack, is now entering the room. Watch as Zack walks in and waves to the crowd. Zack is a tax collector, which means he collects money from the people and gives it to the king.

Watch as Zack claps his hands and in walks Friend 1. Watch as Friend 1 waves to the crowd, then does five jumping jacks. Now watch as Zack holds out his hand and points to his friend. It is time to pay up! Watch as Friend 1 hands Zack some money, makes an angry face, then leaves the room.

Now watch as Zack claps his hands and in walks Friend 2. Watch as Friend 2 waves to the crowd, then does a sweet ninja move. See Zack hold out his hand and point at his friend. It is time to pay up! Watch as Friend 2 hands Zack some money, makes an angry face, then leaves the room.

This is what Zack does every day; this is his job. However, he often takes more money than he is supposed to and keeps the extra cash for himself. You see, Zack loves money! Watch as Zack hugs the money.

One day Jesus is passing through Zack's town. Watch as Jesus walks around the room with the crowd following him. Zack wants to get a good look at Jesus, but he is too short. So Zack decides to climb a tree, I mean, a chair, so he can look at Jesus and hear what Jesus has to say.

Watch as Jesus stops walking and begins moving his mouth up and down, and waving his arms around. Jesus is telling the crowd some great stuff. The crowd loves Jesus' message; watch as the crowd gives Jesus a big thumbs-up!

Now watch as Jesus points to Zack and says, "Come here!" Zack quickly gets off the chair and walks over to Jesus. Watch as Jesus waves his arms around, and moves his mouth up and down. He is talking to Zack, telling Zack about God's love for him.

The crowd is so surprised by Jesus talking to Zack; watch as everyone makes big surprised faces! Why would Jesus talk to someone who steals money from people? Jesus is telling Zack that God loves him and that he is going to have dinner with Zack!

After dinner, Zack is a changed dude! He decides he needs to start helping people instead of stealing from them. Watch as he begins handing out his money to the crowd.

From that day on, Zack followed Jesus and no longer stole money from people.

Great job, everyone. Let's cheer for our actors!
